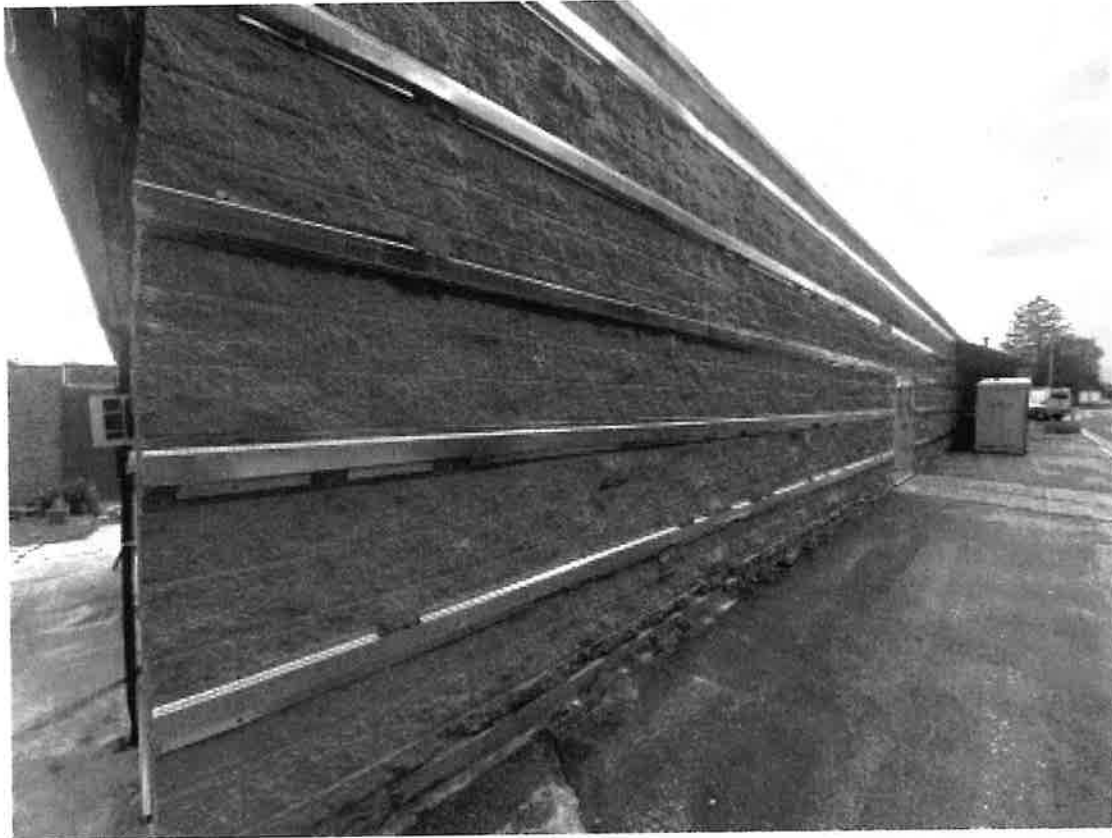

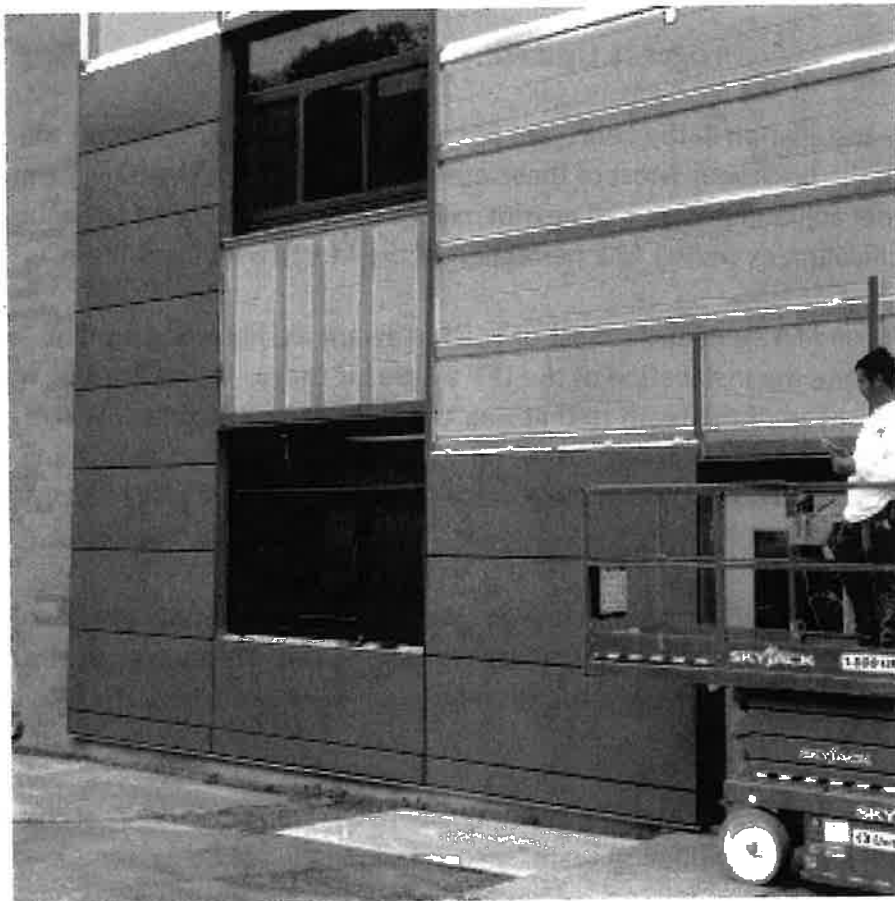

Braun Painting is installing LVP (Liquid Vapor Barrier) to the West side of the building.

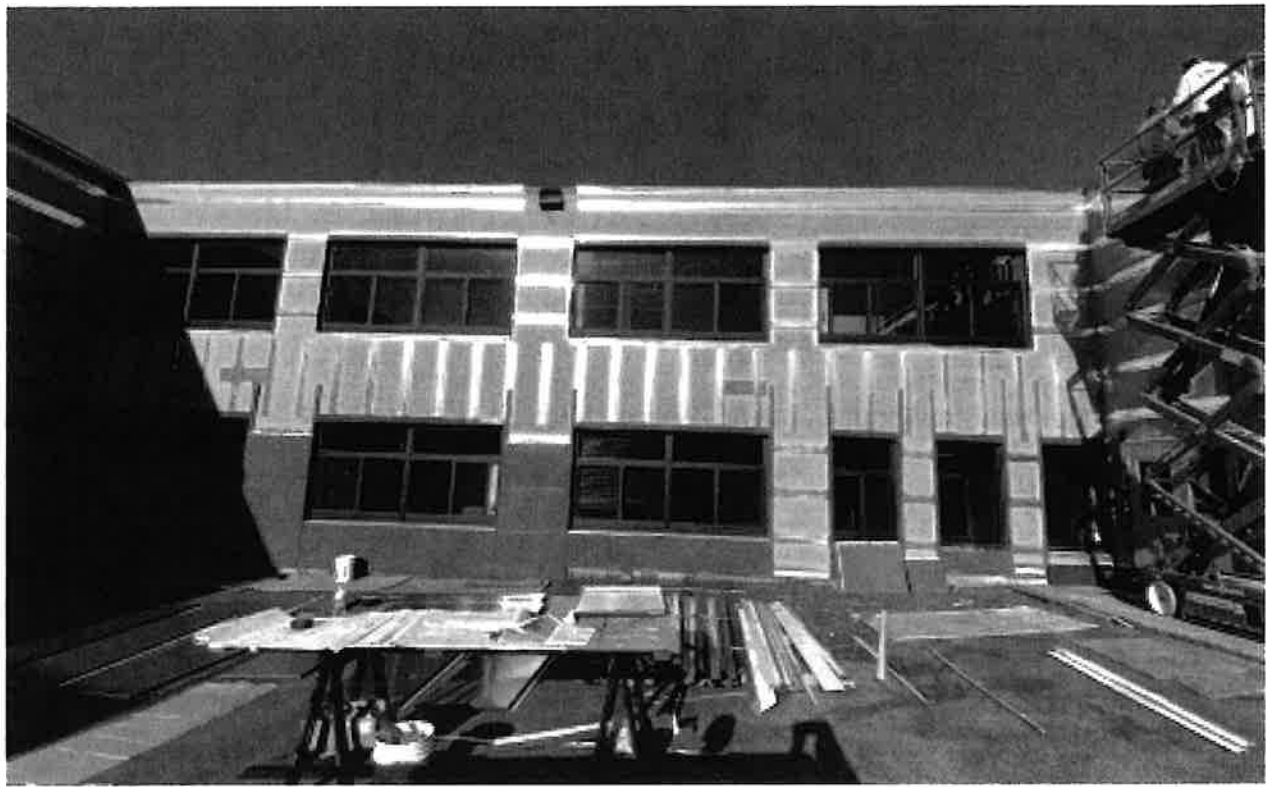
Progress Update:

Courtyard Panel Progress – Installation in the courtyard has taken a little longer to get off the ground and running due to some inaccuracies in the brick wall. Most of these are due to the age of the building and the settling of the building over the years. Panel adjustments as well as trim pieces were reengineered to ensure they lined up perfectly and met the specification as well as the perfection of the Modern Builders Team.

LVP Installation - Rain, Rain, and More Rain. As most of you are aware we have had our fair share of rain this summer. This has certainly made the installation of the LVP a little bit tricky. Braun Painting has been working with Modern Builders to get ahead of the team so that Hat Channels can be installed. We've had a few areas of brick that took on water before the LVP had time to set up. This causes blisters to form along the west wall. Braun Painting team has worked to scrape these areas clean and is in the process of reapplying the LVP to those areas.

Hat Channel Installation – Modern Builders has been working ahead of the panel installation and is well ahead of schedule. This will make for hopefully a quick installation of setting the panels around the building. The main focus over the last 2 weeks has been on the playground area to get ahead of where the kids will soon be playing this fall.

Panel Production from Garland/Imetco – Modern is working with Garland/Imetco to get the specific dimensions for each elevation to the production team. Next set of panels are being produced and will arrive shortly.

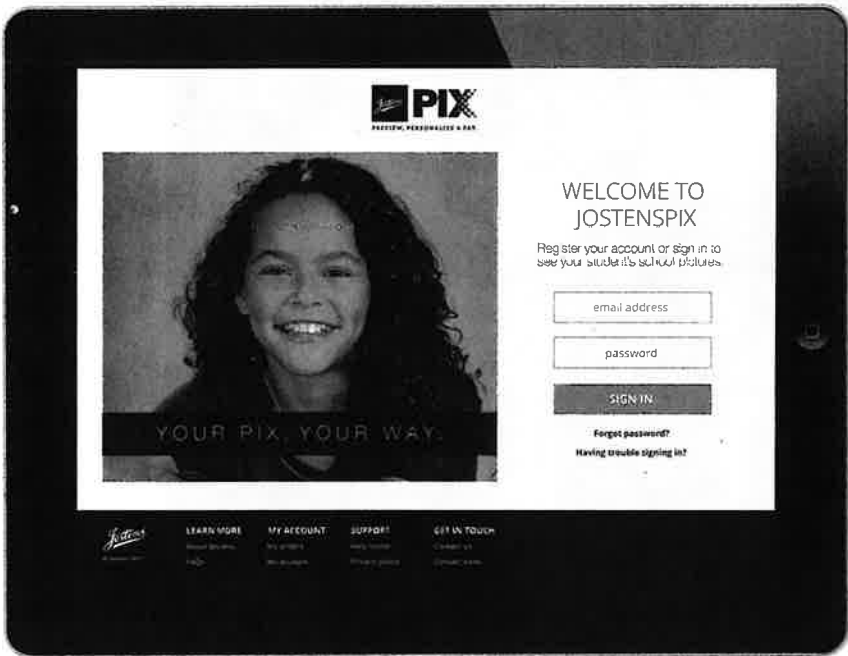

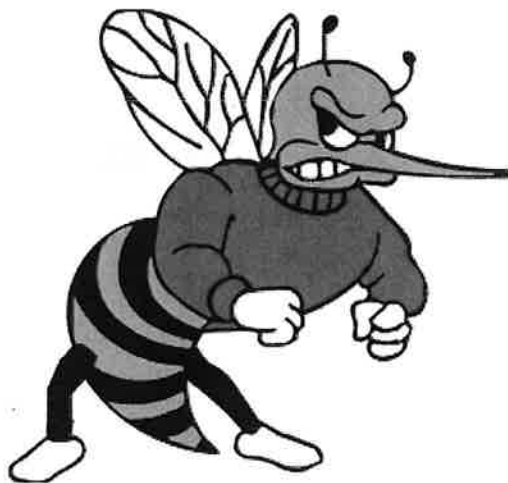
