September Message from Dr. Gary L. Albrecht, Interim District Administrator

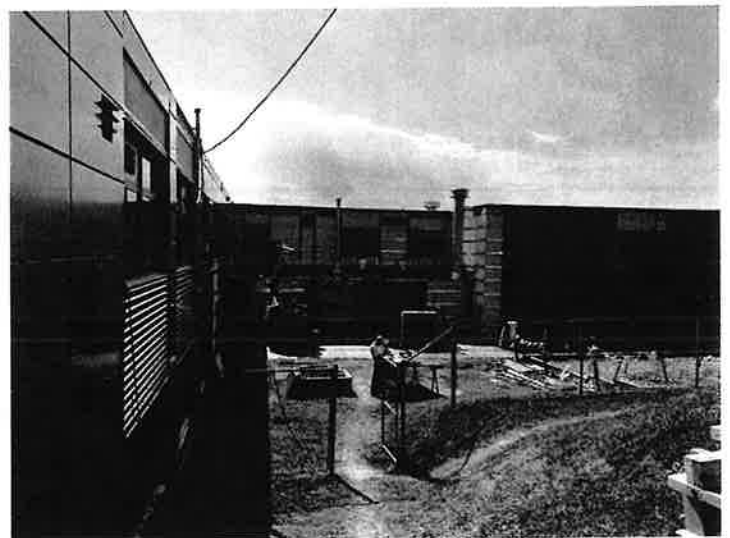

We are off to the start of the new 2024-2025 school year. It's been a pleasure to see our returning students and new students as well; most with smiles :) We are hoping for a healthy school year and the following are some ideas to help us do this.

- Hand washing is still the best way to prevent ANY illness from spreading. Our students wash their hands during the school day several times. Let's set a good example of this at home too, our kids are always watching.
- Receive the annual influenza vaccination. Each year the influenza vaccination is a new formula covering types A and B of influenza. If you would like your child(ren) to receive the influenza vaccine, the Crawford County Health Department will be providing this at school free of charge. A consent form **MUST** be filled out completely for each of your children. **PLEASE DO NOT** send a consent form back to school if you do not want your child(ren) to receive a vaccine. This year you may choose between the nasal mist or the injectable form of the vaccine, forms have been sent home with your child(ren). Consents forms are also available on the school website. If you have questions please reach out to your medical provider or the county health department.
- Receive childhood vaccinations. Wisconsin requires immunizations for school children to help prevent other various contagious illnesses. If your child(ren) is/are not up to date with these requirements a letter was mailed home at the end of the school year. **PLEASE** send the appropriate form(s) back to school, for example an Immunization Waiver form. Required immunizations can be waived by the parents and/or guardian for medical, religious or personal reasons.
- If your child is vomiting, having diarrhea or has a fever please do not send your child to school. They need to be symptom free for 24 hours without any fever reducing medications; like acetaminophen or ibuprofen.
- The early and late fall season weather changes frequently. Please send your child with appropriate clothing; jackets, shoes (not flip-flops), gloves, etc.
- Our mental health is **SO** important! If you feel like your child(ren) would like or need some additional support please reach out to your child's teacher, Mrs Kilburg or Mrs. Dums; services are available right here at school. If you would like support or know someone that does call 988. This is a free service that has trained staff to help 24/7.

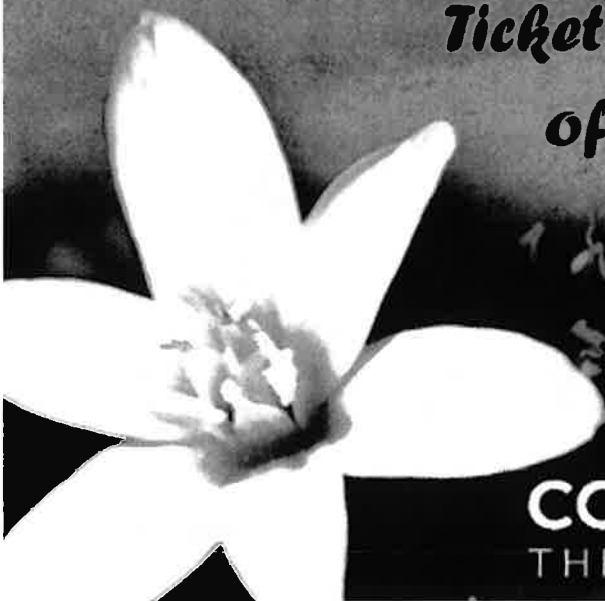

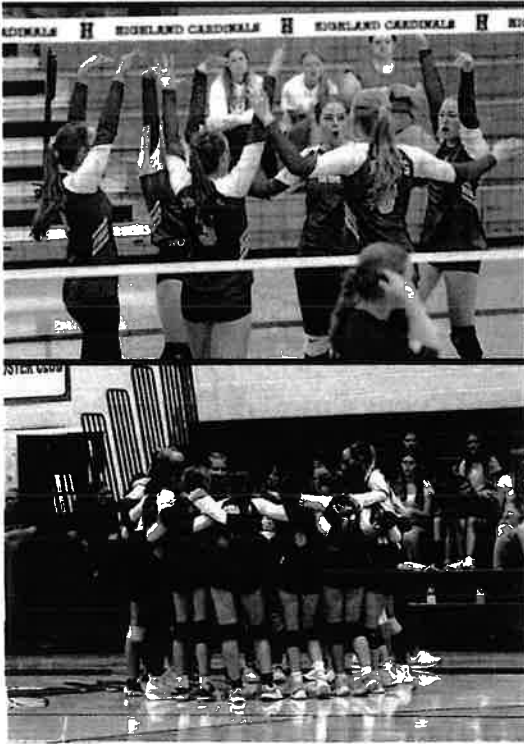
The evening before each cross country meet the whole team gets together for team bonding and to eat lots of pasta for race fuel the next day. This tradition may be part of the team's success.

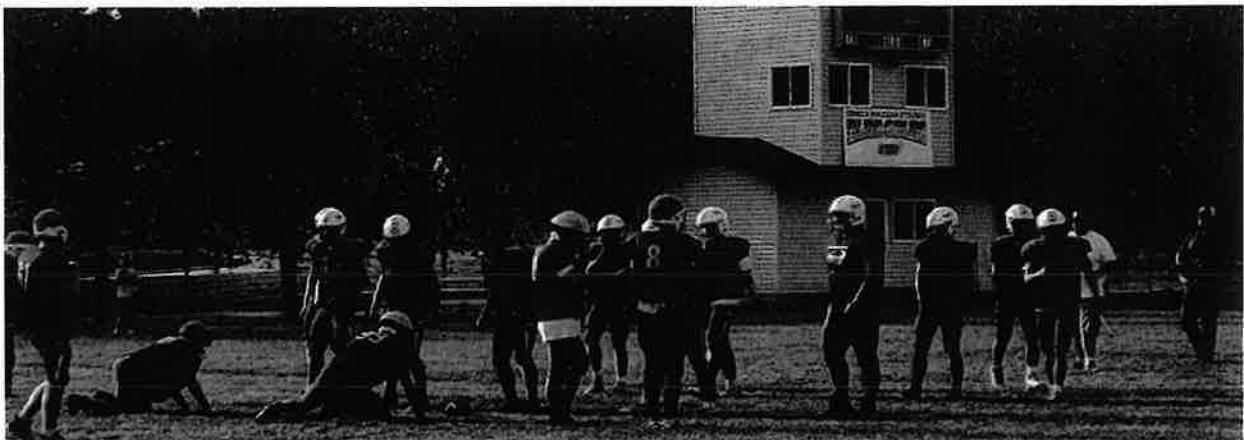
THE WAUZEKA-STEUBEN VOLLEYBALL GIRLS ARE IN FOR A GOOD SEASON

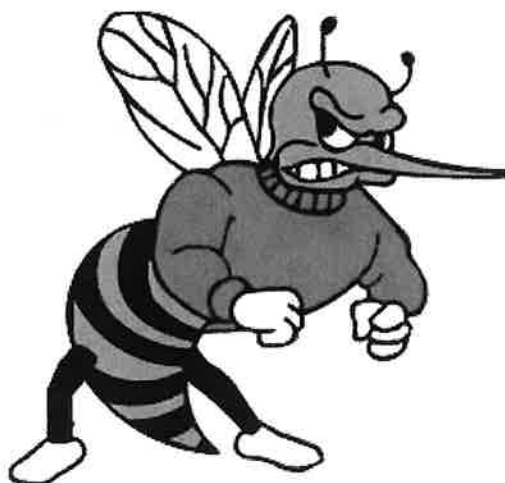

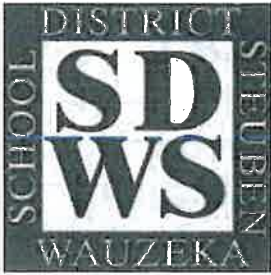
